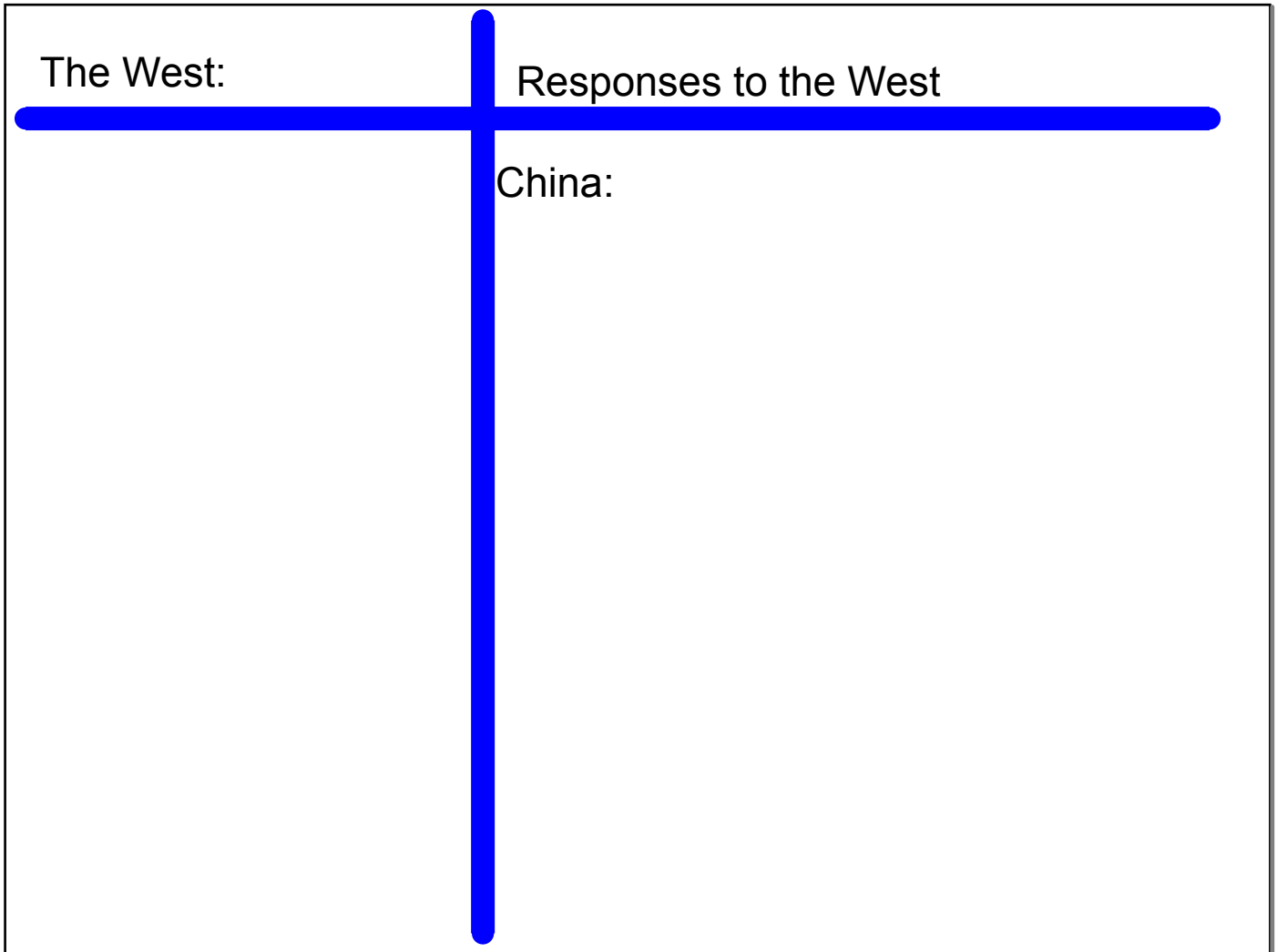

Responses to the West

- China:**
- 1793 Emperor Qianlong rebuffs British attempts at opening trade
 - Central Gov. lost control of provincial landlords/gentry
 - Taiping Uprising-(Xiuquan); racial equality & industrialization; weakens China
 - 1st Opium War: Ch. tried to stop silver drain ; Treaty of Nanjing 1842
 - 2nd Opium War: summer palace, unequal treaties open ports; missionaries; interior waterways open
 - Self-strengthening 1860s & 70s: Conf., exam system; rural & econ. devel.; some industr. & other languages
 - Boxer Rebellion (expel foreigners)-West & Japan crushed
 - Ed. Chinese lose faith in Qing Dynasty (foreign dynasty)
 - > Sun Yat-sen-Nationalist: Enlght. based reforms, republic
 - > Chiang Kai-shek-capitalist
 - How did China respond to the West???

--With Conservatism and few attempts at Modernization: Evidence???
