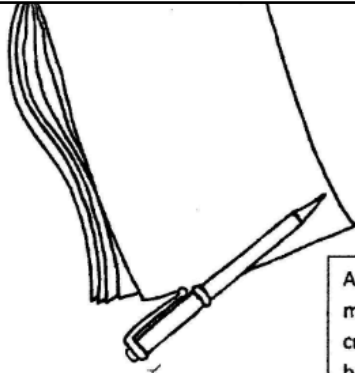

A one-pager is a single-page response to your reading. It is a way of making your own pattern of your unique understanding. It is a way to be creative and experimental. It is a way to respond imaginatively and honestly. It is a way to be brief and compressed in a world drowning in paper. A one-pager is a valuable way to own what you are reading. We learn best when we can create our own patterns.

- Use unlined white paper
- Pull out a quotation or two and write them on the paper. Use them as a springboard to explore your own ideas.
- Use a visual image or images, either drawn or cut out from magazines, to create a central focus for your page
- Cluster around this image dominant impressions, feelings, or thoughts regarding what you have read
- Make a personal statement about what you have read
- Ask at least two questions and answer them
- Create the one-pager in such a way that your audience will understand something of your THINKING about what you have read
- Feel free to use colored pencils, pens, crayons, markers, etc.—the more visually appealing, the more your peers can learn from your patterns
