















World History AP® - Theme Icons

Environment: Human Migration & Patterns of Settlement		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Migration is the permanent change of residence ▪ Causes & effects of migration (PUSH/PULL factors) ▪ Where people live and why they live there, such as: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Impact of geography on human settlement ○ Rural/urban patterns, ethnic enclaves, etc.
Environment: Human Demography, Disease, & Environmental Interaction		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Human demography is the study of human statistics, such as births, deaths, population, etc. ▪ Disease and the impact of disease on human populations and society ▪ Interaction between humans and the environment
Cultures: Religion, Philosophy, & Ideology		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Beliefs about the origins of the universe and life ▪ Development of human cultures and traditions ▪ Beliefs about deities and/or rules that define us ▪ Codes of behavior that support these beliefs ▪ Diffusion of religion and philosophy
Cultures: Architecture, Art, Science, and Technology		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Systems of knowledge that explain the physical and natural world ▪ Causes & effects of tools, equipment, & structures ▪ Features and diffusion of art and how it relates to culture, economy, and political life
Political: Structures, Forms of Rule, & Technology		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Power, decision-making, laws, change & revolution ▪ Governmental offices and how they are organized ▪ Types of rule, such as: Bands/Tribes, Chiefdoms /Kingdoms, States, and Empires ▪ Policies & technologies that help states function
Economic: Production, Labor Systems, Trade, & Technology		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Anything related to money, trade, or earning a living, including farming and herding animals ▪ Goods produced in various cultures and technologies developed to produce/trade goods ▪ Who labors and what motivates them to work
Social: Gender Roles, Organization, Race, & Education		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Family & gender roles and divisions of labor ▪ Social class and stratification/division ▪ Relationships and roles between races & classes ▪ Who gets educated and what they learn
Cross-Cultural Interaction		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ The meeting of cultures usually related to trade, war, diplomacy, or human migration ▪ Causes and effects of cross-cultural encounters ▪ Diffusion of goods, diseases, ideas ▪ Syncretism or blending of ideas and traditions
Continuity and Change		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Continuation of traditions, beliefs, practices over extended periods of time ▪ Causes and effects of CHANGES to political, social, economic, and cultural traditions.
Cause and Effect		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Recognizing agents of change in history ▪ Making connections between events ▪ How/why one event causes another ▪ How/why events are results of prior events ▪ Recognizing & using the language of cause-and-effect
